Participants explore how assessment can be used not only to measure students' progress but also as a tool to help students identify their strengths and weaknesses, then work on their weaknesses.

### Assessment systems and reports:

Participants learn how to select assessment systems suitable for their students' age group as well as how to write reports which provide feedback for parents and other caregivers.
